

Chemical labeling and the move

- All chemicals will be moved by the contractors on your specified move day.
- The contractors require proper labeling of all jars/bottles that contain hazardous and non-hazardous substances.

Hazardous Chemicals

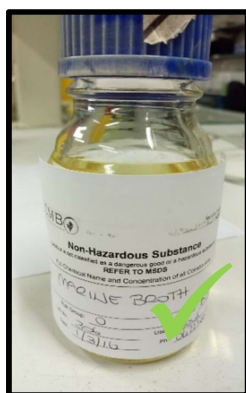


- If the bottle has an original label, then this is enough for the move.
- If a hazardous chemical is in a secondary bottle it must have a chemAlert label to properly identify the substance inside.

Non-Hazardous Chemicals

- Any non-Hazardous chemical with the original label is fine for the move.
- If it is in a different container it will need to have a label on it identifying it as Non-Hazardous with the name of the contents, such as the below example.



- It is a UNSW responsibility to remove any unwanted chemicals before the move, there should be no chemicals left in labs after the move. Any chemicals not meeting the conditions above will not be moved.
